We celebrate the achievements of 2014-2015, but understand that there is still work to be done in bringing up our lower performing students, as well as, offering opportunities and course offerings which will continue to challenge and stretch our top performing students. We feel that by implementing a more uniform system of test administration, data collection, and focused feedback for both student and teacher, we can improve upon our past successes. We also believe that through continued intervention and targeted support, we can improve the performance of all students in grades 7-12.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Centreville Jr/Sr High enrolls students in grades 7 through 12 who are residents of the Centreville Public School District, students in grades 9 through 12 who are residents of Nottawa Community Schools District, or students who are participants in the St. Joseph County Schools of Choice Program.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Centreville Junior / Senior High School Improvement Plan was revamped during the 2012-2013 school year to accommodate the new Assist platform from Advanc-Ed. During the the '14-'15 school year, the plan was reviewed on numerous occasions and revised for the '15-'16 school year. In the revision process, the staff reviewed their existing goals, strategies, and activities and adjusted them according to the progress that has been made. Because most of the goals were rewritten in '12-'13 and were 3-5 year goals, there were very few that were completed this past school year and will remain in effect for the upcoming school year. 3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Covered Bridge School:

Covered Bridge School is an alternative high school located in the community education building. Covered Bridge School provides students with the opportunity to earn high school credits in a non-traditional setting. On-line classes are available through Ed Options and GenNet. Placement in the Covered Bridge School is determined by a meeting of the following participants: Jr/Sr High Principal, Counselor, Covered Bridge Teacher, parents, and the student.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

Career Technical Education (CTE) classes are held at six locations throughout the county. Host schools include Three Rivers, Glen Oaks,

Sturgis, Mendon, White Pigeon, and Centreville. Centreville hosts two of the programs.

Centreville high school students participated in the following CTE programs: Agri-Science, Automotive Technologies, Building Trades, Computer Aided Design, Computer Applications for Business, Computer Information Technologies, Electro-mechanical, Marketing Education, Manufacturing Technology, Medical Occupations.

Students are selected for CTE programs based on their career interests as determined by the student's Educational Development Plan (EDP). This process begins in the junior high and prepares students for a CTE program choice for the junior and/or senior years.

4. CORE CURRICULUM:

A copy of our core curriculum may be obtained in the old junior high office. Our current curriculum includes all of the State of Michigan's Grade Level Content Expectations as well as the National Common Core. Currently, we have completed our 3rd year of implementing the national common core curriculum standards in ELA and Mathematics. During the 2014-2015 school year, we continued the work of creating a website which will house all of the core content area curriculum for Centreville Junior/Senior High School. This is an ongoing project and will continue into the '15-'16 school year.

5. THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES:

Each year the Centreville Junior / Senior High School holds parent-teacher conferences in the fall and again in the spring. The fall conferences had 62 or 43% of junior high students represented by a parent, while in the senior high we had 83 or 30% of senior high students represented by a parent. This compares to 2013 fall attendance numbers of 63 or 50% in the junior high and 84 or 32% in the senior high. The spring conferences held in March had 24% parent turn out in the junior high and 17% in the senior high.

6. AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR LOCAL AND NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS:

ACT 2015 Test results show that Centreville High School scores did increase from the previous year's performance. In summary, the '14-'15 class outperformed the state in all subject areas except math. We believe that these results better reflect the performance expectations for our students and that the previous year's results were not the norm for our school. The '13-'14 results were somewhat anticipated because that class had traditionally performed, as a cohort group, at a lower level when compared with previous testing data and other classes. We believe this was in large part to a high number of at-risk students. Again, we believe the '14-'15 results better reflect what our students are capable of obtaining as a cohort group.

Centreville Junior/Senior High is proud of the accomplishments of our students and staff during the 2014-2015 school year. We celebrated a graduation rate of 100% again this year! Of our 2015 senior class, 87% plan to attend either a two-year or four-year college, while 90% of the class were in programs that prepared them for this post-secondary success either through dual enrollment or CTE. Centreville Jr/Sr High School continues to rank as one of the top schools in our county for dual enrollment, even when compared to larger districts. Our school provides an enrichment class for all high school students which offers grade appropriate content that focuses on such things as test preparation for state tests and college entrance exams, college search and application completion, financial aid and scholarships, senior portfolios, Khan Academy for remediation, as well as, book club, cooking, trivia competitions, and a variety of other life skills. Again, this year we also had successful junior and senior high Quiz Bowl teams which received both conference and county recognition. The senior high continues to foster a supportive and nurturing environment through the Freshmen Mentoring Program for incoming 9th graders, and our junior and senior high offers students numerous ways to connect and better, not only themselves, but in some cases their community as well. These opportunities include our Green Team, Government and NHS service projects, and the FFA Food Drive. We also provided numerous other opportunities to enrich or involve students such as Quiz Bowl, Science Olympiad, Code Academy, Historical Society Club, Power Lifting, Junior High Math Meet, a full athletic program, and many other clubs and activities as well. Here at Centreville Jr/Sr High School we will continue to focus on student achievement during the coming school year and strive to achieve even greater success. Our staff continues to demonstrate a dedication to the mission of delivering a safe, superior education through the application of best practices, quality feedback, and continual improvement through self-reflection. We look forward to working with parents and community members as we continue our success.
