

Centreville Adult Education School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2011-2012 educational progress for **Centreville Adult Education**. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. Adequate Yearly Progress is not reported for Adult Education Programs.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING STUDENTS TO THE SCHOOL

Centreville Adult Education enrolls adults who reside in St. Joseph County and who have not earned a high school diploma or a GED.

Centreville Adult Education also operates a GED preparation program at the St. Joseph County jail for incarcerated adults. All adults who have not earned a GED Certificate are eligible for enrollment.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Adult Education Programs are not required to prepare a School Improvement Plan. Each year, however, we present a Program Operation Plan to the State of Michigan. A copy of our plan is available in the Community Education Office.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Centreville Adult Education provides GED preparation for residents of St. Joseph County. The GED Preparation program assists students in mastering the content and skills contained within the five separate GED Tests (Language Arts Writing, Language Arts Reading, Science, Social Studies and Math).

4. CORE CURRICULUM:

A copy of our core curriculum may be obtained from Mrs. Lester, Curriculum Director, in the former junior high office. Our current curriculum includes all of the State of Michigan's High School Content Expectations.

Adult Education students preparing for GED Testing follow the curriculum included in the GED Preparation materials.

5. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS MME AND NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

Aggregate student achievement results are not available for Adult Education students. Our Adult Education program uses the TABE Test for pre, post, and progress testing.

6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent-Teacher Conferences are not held for Adult Education students.

We are pleased to have the opportunity to offer this program to our community. Over the past 22 years, 197 students have completed requirements for their high school diploma and 470 have earned their GED Certificate through our programs. For 2012, three students obtained their GED Certificate. During the coming year we will continue to focus on assisting adults to receive their high school diploma or a GED Certificate.
