For 2009-2010, Centreville High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. In addition, our high school has made Adequate Yearly Process each year, beginning with the 2001-2002 school year. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

### **1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL**

Centreville High School enrolls students in grades 9 through 12 who are residents of the Centreville Public Schools District, Nottawa Community Schools District, or who are participants in the St. Joseph County Schools of Choice Program.

### **2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN**

Our Centreville High School Improvement Plan was revised during the 2009-2010 school year. During the 2010 - 2011 our staff will begin work on our revised school improvement goals, objectives, and strategies. ### **3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL / PROGRAM**

#### **Covered Bridge School:**

Covered Bridge School is an Alternative High School located in the high school building. Covered Bridge School provides students with the

opportunity to earn high school credits in a non-traditional setting. On-line classes are available through EdOptions and GenNet.

Placement in the Covered Bridge School is determined following a meeting of the following participants: High School Principal, High School Counselor / Social Worker, Covered Bridge Teacher, parents, and the student.

### **Career Technical Education (CTE):**

Career Technical Education (CTE) classes are held at six locations throughout the county. Host schools include Three Rivers, Glen Oaks, Sturgis, Mendon, White Pigeon, and Centreville. Centreville hosts three of the programs.

Centreville students participated in the following CTE programs: Agri-Science, Automotive Technologies, Building Trades, Computer Aided Design, Computer Applications for Business, Computer Information Technologies, Early Childhood Education, Electro-mechanical, Marketing Education, Manufacturing Technology, Medical Occupations, Internships, and Externships.

Students are selected for CTE programs based on their career interests as determined by the student Educational Development Plan (EDP). This process begins in the junior high and prepares students for a CTE program choice for the junior and/or senior years.

## **4. CORE CURRICULUM:**

A copy of our core curriculum may be obtained from Mrs. Lester, Curriculum Director, in the junior high office. Our current curriculum includes all of the State of Michigan's Grade Level Content Expectations. During the 2010-2011 school year, we will revise our curriculum to include the national common core curriculum.

## **5. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR MME AND OTHER NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS**

Michigan Merit Exam (MME) 2010 Test results show that Centreville High School scores demonstrated improvement in all of the ACT subtests and on the following MME subtests: Mathematics, Reading, Science, and Writing. In addition, Centreville High School students scored at or above the state average on the MME Mathematics, Reading, Science, Social Studies, and Writing Tests. **6. THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES**

Each year Centreville High School holds parent-teacher conferences in the fall and again in the spring. The high school fall conferences had 90 or 32% of students represented by a parent. This compares with 97 or 33% parent attendance rate in the fall of 2008.

**7. POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENT / DUAL ENROLLMENT**

Centreville High School Students have the opportunity to enroll in AP/College level courses at Glen Oaks, Michigan Virtual High School, and other high schools within the county.
