For 2011-2012, Centreville Senior High School made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in reading and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal in all core content areas, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Centreville Senior High enrolls students in grades 9 through 12 who are residents of the Centreville Public School District, Nottawa Community Schools District, or who are participants in the St. Joseph County Schools or Choice Program.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Our Centreville Senior High School Improvement Plan was revised during the 2009-2010 school year. During the 2011-2012 school year, junior high and high school staff members worked together to develop school improvement goals, objectives, and strategies for the combined junior high / high school building. 3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Covered Bridge School:

Covered Bridge School is an alternative high school located in the community education building. Covered Bridge School provides students with the opportunity to earn high school credits in a non-traditional setting. On-line classes are available through EdOptions and GenNet.

Placement in the Covered Bridge School is determined by a meeting of the following participants: Jr/Sr High Principal, Counselor, Covered Bridge Teacher, parents, and the student.

Career Technical Education (CTE)

Career Technical Education (CTE) classes are held at six locations throughout the county. Host schools include Three Rivers, Glen Oaks, Sturgis, Mendon, White Pigeon, and Centreville. Centreville hosts three of the programs.

Centreville students participated in the following CTE programs: Agri-Science, Automotive Technologies, Building Trades, Computer Aided Design, Computer Applications for Business, Computer Information Technologies, Electro-mechanical, Marketing Education, Manufacturing Technology, Medical Occupations, Internships, and Externships.

Students are selected for CTE programs based on their career interests as determined by the student's Educational Development Plan (EDP). This process begins in the junior high and prepares students for a CTE program choice for the junior and/or senior years.

4. CORE CURRICULUM:

A copy of our core curriculum may be obtained in the former junior high office. Our current curriculum includes all of the State of Michigan's Grade Level Content Expectations. During the 2011-2012 school year, we continued the process of revising our curriculum to include the national Common Core Curriculum standards.

5. AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR LOCAL AND NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS:

Michigan Merit Exam (MME) 2012 Test results show that Centreville High School scores demonstrated improvement in all of the MME subtests, the ACT Composite score, and on the following ACT subtests: English+ Writing, Writing, English, Reading, Science, and Mathematics.

In addition, Centreville High School Students scored at or above the state average in all areas of the MME, ACT Composite, and ACT subtests.

6. THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES:

Each year Centreville High School holds parent-teacher conferences in the fall and again in the spring. The high school fall conferences had 122 or 43% of students represented by a parent. This compares with 54 or 20% parent attendance in the fall of 2010.

7. POSTSECONDARY ENROLLEMNT / DUAL ENROLLMENT

Centreville High School Students have the opportunity to enroll in AP/College level courses at Glen Oaks Community College, Michigan Virtual High School, and other high schools within the county.
