During the 2010-2011 school year, Centreville Junior High made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English Language Arts and mathematics and received an "A" on the annual EdYes School Report Card. In addition, our junior high has made Adequate Yearly Progress each year, beginning with the 2001-2002 school year. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff, and our community in this effort.

State law requires that we also report the following additional information:

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Centreville Junior High enrolls students in grades 7 or 8 who are residents of the Centreville Public Schools District or who are participants in the St. Joseph County Schools of Choice Program.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Our Centreville Junior High School Improvement Plan was revised during the 2009-2010 school year. During the 2010 - 2011 our staff began work on our revised school improvement goals, objectives, and strategies. 3. A DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

Covered Bridge School:

Covered Bridge School is an alternative high school located in the community education building. Covered Bridge School provides students with the opportunity to earn high school credits in a non-

traditional setting. On-line classes are available through EdOptions and GenNet. Placement in the Covered Bridge School is determined following a meeting of the following participants: High School Principal, High School Counselor / Social Worker, Covered Bridge Teacher, parents, and the student.

4. CORE CURRICULUM:

A copy of our core curriculum may be obtained in the former junior high office. Our current curriculum includes all of the State of Michigan’s Grade Level Content Expectations. During the 2010-2011 school year, we began the process of revising our curriculum to include the national common core curriculum standards.

5. AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR LOCAL AND NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS:

MICHIGAN EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (MEAP) TEST RESULTS:

MEAP 2010 Test results show that Centreville Junior High students scored above the state average on the following tests: Reading Grades 7 and 8, Mathematics Grades 7 and 8, and Science Grade 8. 2009-2010 MEAP Results are available on the website (www.cpschools.org)

EXPLORE 8th GRADE TEST RESULTS:

The chart below indicates the average score performance of Centreville 8th Graders on the ACT EXPLORE Tests. The chart also compares the results of our students with students nationwide for the 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 school years. Centreville 8th Grade students scored above the national average in each of the EXPLORE subtests.
