

# Centreville Public Schools

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- As a relatively small high school we are proud to offer our students a variety of opportunities comparable to larger schools in order to prepare our students for life beyond graduation. Below are some statistics that show how we are accomplishing this goal.
- Of our senior class, 97% are in programs/courses that prepare them for post-secondary success:
  - 40% are dual enrolling (taking college courses at GOCC)
  - 41% are in a CTE program or work-based learning experiences learning job skills
  - 16% are in an online elective class exploring subjects that we wouldn't otherwise have the resources to offer (German, American Sign Language, Personal Finance, Earth Science, World Religions, World Geography, Digital Photography, Forensic Science and 1960s America)
- Of our students in grades 9-12, 19% are taking at least one online class, either for credit recovery or to take an elective class not offered at our school. Some of the elective courses include Japanese, French, AP European History, Global Mythology, Accounting and Sociology.
- Additionally, sixteen students are enrolled in independent study classes with our teachers as a means to allow students to go further in the curriculum.
- Forty-one juniors and seniors-30% of our upperclassmen-are currently taking a combined total of 66 college classes. The number of students taking these classes places Centreville High School as one of the top schools in the county for dual enrollment placements, even among the schools that offer dual enrollment classes within their building. Additionally, students enrolled in some CTE programs receive direct credit from Glen Oaks Community College.
- In keeping with our school vision, we continue to look for creative ways to provide students with an individualized experience, one that will best prepare them for their future academic and career goals.
