REMEMBER TO IMMUNIZE

Required Childhood Immunizations for Michigan School Settings

School communicable disease rules are the minimum standard for preventing disease outbreaks in school settings. To best protect patients from all diseases we have the power to prevent, healthcare providers in Michigan should follow the 2014 Recommended Immunization Schedule at www.cdc.gov/vaccines or www.michigan.gov/immunize.
****All doses of vaccines must be given with appropriate spacing between doses and at appropriate ages to be considered valid.****

Elementary Dress Code

It is the responsibility of the parents and/or individual student to set guidelines for appropriate dress within reasonable standards of social acceptance. However, the following styles or manners of dress are not allowed:

- Clothing that promotes antisocial behavior, violence, obscenity, vulgarity or profanity, sexual inference or logos referring to drugs or alcohol.
- Halter tops, tank tops with narrow straps and/or those that are low-cut; short shorts; spaghetti-strap tops and/or dresses; hats; torn or mutilated clothing.
- Wallet and dog chains.
- All shorts must be appropriate in length, using fingertip length as a guideline. Lycra/biker shorts are not allowed, unless covered by loose shorts.
- Hats/bandanas/sweatshirt hoods worn as head coverings.
- Coats or other outerwear worn during the school day.

Attendance Procedures

Regular attendance at school is vitally important to each student as it directly affects academic progress, as well as the development of attitudes and habits for life.

Please call Mrs. Reed the attendance secretary at 467-5203 by 9:00 a.m. when your child is absent from school. School personnel will attempt to call you if they have not heard from you. If you are not contacted, send a note with your child upon his or her return to school. Please remember, it is important to report any communicable diseases such as measles, chicken pox, flu, pink eye, etc.

A student is considered tardy if arriving at school between 7:52 and 8:15 a.m. Persistent tardiness will be considered a violation of the discipline policy. If a student arrives after 8:15 a.m. and before the student's lunch, he or she will be marked absent for the morning. Anytime a student is gone after lunch, he or she will be marked absent for the afternoon. Please consider this policy before scheduling doctor and dentist appointments, as it relates to perfect attendance.

KINDERGARTEN

Children turning 5 before September 1, 2016, are eligible to begin school this fall. If you have not already enrolled your child or if you have any questions, please call the elementary at 467-5200.

GREAT START READINESS PROGRAM (GSRP)

Centreville Elementary School will again be hosting GSRP, which began in the 2006-2007 school year. This is a free preschool to four-year-old children. It is estimated that nearly 81,000 four-year-old children have circumstances in their family that may affect their ability to become successful in school. The GSRP is Michigan's preschool program to help them get ready for school. Enrollment is based on eligibility requirements. Children must be four years of age, but not yet five, by September 1, 2016. If you are interested and have a child that may be eligible, please contact Centreville Elementary School at 467-5200.

This year-long course is highly recommended as a prerequisite for all other agricultural classes. 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Welcome to the 2016-17 school year! I hope you all had a safe and relaxing summer. We are excited and busily preparing for the start of another school year. I would like to personally welcome those families who are coming to our district for the first time. We have a tremendous staff who are committed to providing an excellent educational experience for all of our students.

First of all, I would like to inform you of a change in our school calendar and schedule. The most significant change to the schedule involves delayed starts. Each Friday, school will start one hour later than our normal start time. Buses will run one hour later and we will dismiss at our normal time. During these delayed starts, teachers will use this time to collaborate on topics including curriculum alignment, instructional practices, and assessments. This is valuable time for our staff and will enable them to continue their work towards improving our classroom culture of thinking and learning. In addition, we have scheduled six half-days for students. Four of those are scheduled on Fridays throughout the year. On all half-days (including Fridays), school will start at the regular time and dismiss at 11:30.

Last year we started a robotics club as part of our STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) initiative. This year we have partnered with an organization, Project Lead the Way, that provides STEM training and curriculum. We will be adding STEM courses in our elementary and junior high starting this fall. Upper elementary students will be exposed to STEM activities in their science courses. Lower elementary students will have STEM opportunities during their enrichment classes. In the junior high we are offering a nine-week STEM exploratory class for eighth graders. The course focuses on design and modeling concepts. We are very excited about the opportunities these courses offer our students.

We have added new interior security cameras in both of our buildings. These upgraded cameras are more efficient and make our buildings safer and more secure. Our number one priority remains the safety of our students.

Dennis Kirby has resigned as our Jr./Sr. High School Principal. We are in the process of finding his replacement and will make an announcement as soon as that occurs.
