SCHOOL HEALTH SCREENING AGREEMENT

For the health and safety of our students, the health department requires students be screened for symptoms of COVID-19 each day before school. The health department and the CDC do not recommend these screenings be done by the school because of the time it would take and the disruption to education it would cause.

Prior to arrival at school it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to screen their student as outlined in the School Health Screening Agreement. The School Health Screening Agreement must be submitted to the school office no later than the student's first school day of the 2020-2021 school year.

LOCKERS

In an effort to maintain and promote social distancing, students will not be provided access to hallway and/or gym lockers. Building administration reserves the right to exempt students from this policy.

BAGS, PURSES, COATS and OTHER PERSONAL BELONGINGS

When lockers are not available for student use, students may carry bags, purses, and personal belongings to/from class as long as those items are not a distraction to the educational setting, are school appropriate, meet Code of Conduct standards, and are deemed safe for the school setting, as determined by school personnel. Hoods and hats are not permitted within the building. Teachers and school personnel reserve the right to establish classroom locations for student bags, purses, coats, and other personal belongings. Centreville JR/SR High School is not responsible for lost or stolen bags, purses, coats, or any other personal belongings.

CELL PHONES and ELECTRONIC DEVICES

When appropriate, teachers reserve the right to permit and/or deny student use of cell phones and electronic devices during instructional time. Cell phone and electronic device usage is not permitted in restrooms or locker rooms. Building personnel reserves the right to deny cell phone and electronic device usage when/where necessary for the safety of all students. Centreville JR/SR High School is not responsible for lost or stolen cell phones or electronic devices.

FOOD AND BEVERAGES

Food and beverages will be allowed in classrooms during designated times. Proper disposal of food and beverages is required.

PASSING TIME

Students are expected to transition to class within the allotted passing time while following social distancing protocols and designated hallway traffic patterns.

MASKS

Students are required to wear a mask in all locations at all times as required by the State of Michigan. Masks must be school appropriate and meet Code of Conduct standards. The school reserves the right to provide students with an appropriate mask if deemed necessary. Additionally masks must be worn in an appropriate manner to ensure student/staff safety.

HYBRID SCHEDULE--REMOTE SCHOOL DAY and COLA

Students are responsible for the continuation of learning during their remote school day and/or COLA designation and are subject to Code of Conduct policies that are deemed appropriate to their designated setting.

ASSIGNED SEATING

Students will be expected to sit in the teacher assigned desk/table/area.

CLOSED AREAS

Students are not permitted in areas throughout campus that are designated as closed to students.

TECHNOLOGY USAGE

All Google products and school provided devices are owned and operated by Centreville Public Schools and subject to appropriate use as outlined in the technology agreement and policies of the student Code of Conduct.

PARENT/GUARDIAN CONSENT for SCREENING ASSESSMENT
