Centreville Public Schools plans to follow the MANDATES issued by our local health department and MDHHS. Masks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• As long as masks are not mandated, masks will remain optional and left up to the individual.• Masks will be available in each building office for staff and students who prefer to wear a mask.• We are waiting for information regarding mask requirements on busses.
Screening, Testing, and Contact Tracing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• If your child is sick or feeling ill, please do not send them to school.• Please contact your building office if your child will not be in school due to illness.• If your child tests positive for COVID, please contact the school and those that may be affected. Unless the health department mandates it, the school will not be contact-tracing.• COVID-19 antigen tests will be available in the jr/sr high school office for any parent who wants their child to be tested.• Questions or concerns regarding contact tracing? Please contact the Branch-Hillsdale-St. Joseph County Health Department at 269-273-2161.
Vaccination	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We will continue to support our local health department with promoting vaccines.
Maintaining Healthy Environments	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Our custodial staff has implemented a number of new cleaning procedures.• Devices have been purchased to disinfect and clean our facilities.• Daily procedures are in place to provide a safe, clean environment.

As we receive more information regarding the ever-changing recommendations and requirements for responding to COVID-19, we will continue to communicate with you. In the meantime, if you have a child who is 12 years old or older and would like to have them vaccinated, we will be hosting a vaccination clinic at the jr/sr high school gym on July 28th, from 2-4 p.m. We are encouraging athletes, coaches, and umpires to take extra consideration to prevent disruptions to next years' athletic seasons due to quarantine requirements should there be a positive case or outbreak. No appointment is required! Just show up with your child!
